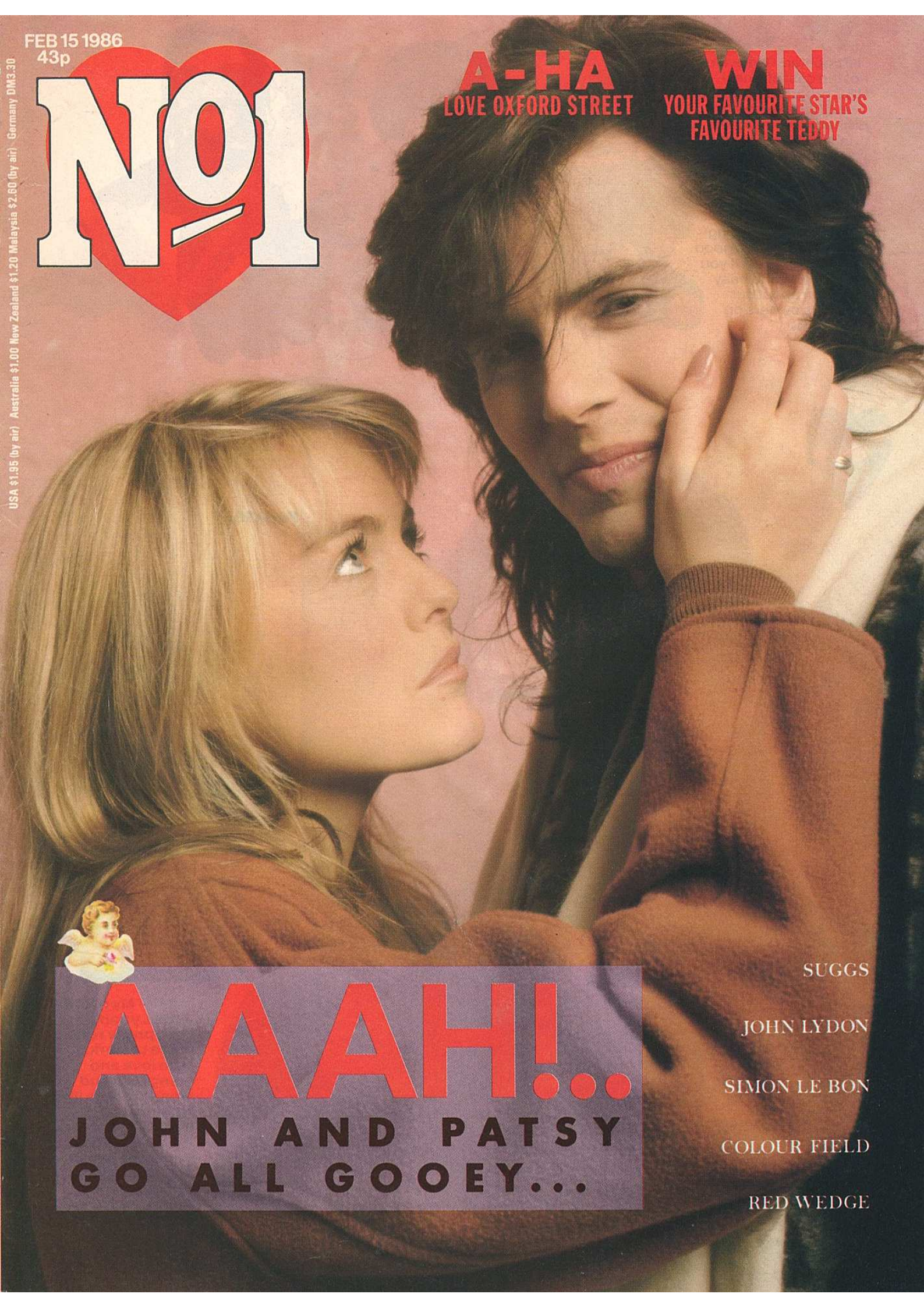

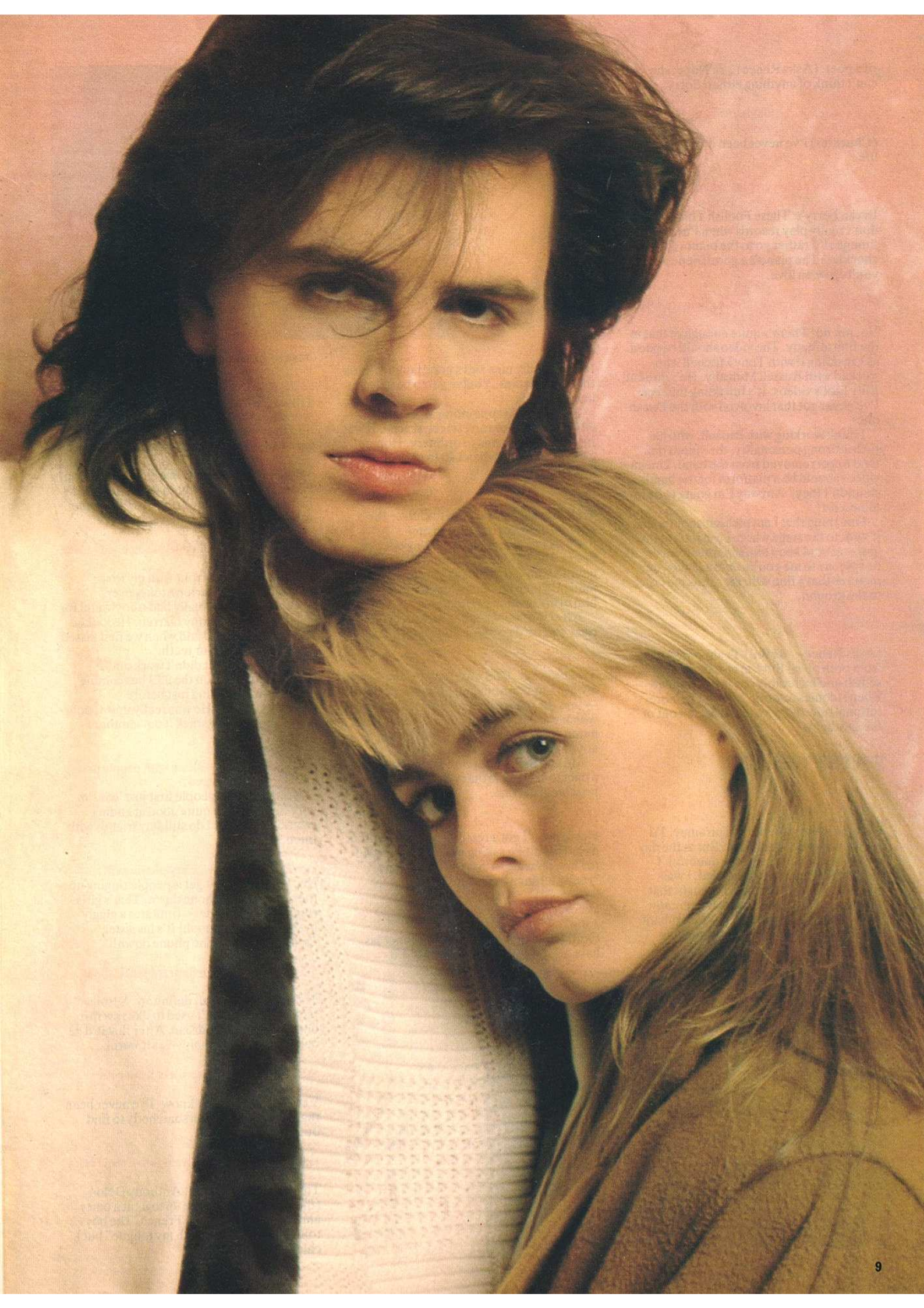
What's your favourite line from a love song?
